Anne Cooper, chair of the innovation workshop and former Chief Nurse at NHS Digital said: "Our hospitals are under growing pressure, so we need to take new approaches. There is so much opportunity to use innovative technology to shift care into the community and people's homes. But staff across the NHS need tools to help them, and this new toolkit is a welcome contribution. It's exciting to think about what the future holds."
